Main duties and responsibilities:

Plan and deliver cycle training sessions - Bikeability courses and other cycle training

- Ensure delivery of Bikeability courses are in line with the National Standard and Bikeability Delivery Guide
- Work with fellow instructors to deliver progressive, enjoyable and inclusive sessions
- Provide accurate and instructive assessments of riders taking part in sessions
- Communicate and liaise effectively with pupils, school staff, parents / carers and clients
- Carry all necessary equipment to and during training sessions
- Adhere to the BikeRight! guidelines on Duty of Care for riders
- Adhere to the BikeRight! guidance on Safe Training Practice and Management of Risk
- To ensure that all rider related paperwork assessment records and certificates of rider progression - is completed accurately and in a timely manner
- Report all course information and feedback promptly to BikeRight online management system - CCOMS
- Promote BikeRight! and maximise its reputation
- Any other duties as requested by the Operations Manager and Training Manager

- Be able to work 5 days a week during school term time

- Be over 18 and able to communicate effectively in English (this includes listening, speaking, reading and writing).
