Bike Right will soon be coming to your child's school to run a Bikeability Level 3 course.


What is Bikeability Level 3?

Bikeability is the government's national cycle training programme. Pupils take part in small groups for at least two hours with our qualified instructors on a 1:3 ratio. **There is no cost to take part.**

Level 3 is aimed at young people who have already completed their Bikeability Level 2, usually in primary school. Level 3 develops riders' skills and confidence in more challenging on-road environments. This may include riding on busier roads, more complicated junctions or faster roads with speed limits above 30mph. We recommend Level 3 for young people who would like to cycle to high school. What will my child need?

- The ability to ride a cycle unaided. This can be a two-wheeled bike with no stabilisers or an adapted cycle.
- A signed consent form. Please complete on the next page and return to school at least one week before the first day of the course.
- A cycle helmet.
- Appropriate clothing. It is important, especially during the cooler months, that children
 wear gloves and warm, dry clothing as they will be outside during their session. We
 recommend wearing a waterproof!
- A road worthy cycle. Please follow the simple guide below to check whether your child's cycle is suitable. See law on the use of e-bikes www.gov.uk/electric-bike-rules



Please note that children cannot take part if their bikes are considered unsafe.

Terms and Conditions for school cycle training

Parent / Carer please read carefully. If you agree, please sign the consent form.

- This consent form **MUST** be signed by the child's parent / carer
- All trainees MUST wear an approved cycle helmet while undertaking the training and the supplied high-visibility waistcoat
- The instructor will determine if the trainee is able to control their cycle sufficiently well to take part in the training
- A training assessment takes place initially in the school playground. If the trainees have reached the required standard, they will then be taken out onto local roads for on road training
- Training will cover all aspects of safer cycling, including recommended procedures for starting, stopping, turning left and right, developing skills and basic strategies for dealing with traffic
- I agree that the instructor(s) can adjust my child's cycle if necessary
- I am responsible for providing my child with suitable clothing for cycling
